Light snacks will be available at sport venues throughout the day.


Opening Ceremony Dinner

When you board a GOVA vehicle to get to an event, tell the driver you are going to the 55+ Games to receive a free ride.



Games Medal Design

Greater Sudbury is known as the mining capital of Canada. The outline of this design uses a 12-sided shape to mimic the Big Nickel, one of the city's most iconic landmarks. The waves layered with land represent the more than 300 lakes located within city limits. The trees symbolize summer, as well as the decades of re-greening and environmental rehabilitation that have taken place in and around Greater Sudbury.

The city is also home to a large Francophone population and vibrant Indigenous communities, making it a cultural hub in Northern Ontario. The fleur-de-lis represents French heritage. identity, resilience and pride. The sun, often referred to as "Grandfather Sun" by Anishinaabe communities in the area, is a spiritual being that provides light, warmth, energy and life to all things.




