Sudbury Highlights: That's So Sudbury

Let's talk about what's so Sudbury. Here are some of Sudbury's most popular things to do!

Big Nickel & Dynamic Earth

122 Big Nickel Road

First things first, find the Big Nickel! No trip to Sudbury is complete without a selfie in front of the iconic 9-metre coin, located on site at Dynamic Earth. While you're there, head inside to explore Sudbury's earth science and mining museum. Descend seven storeys underground for an unforgettable tour through the history of mining.

Note: Plan for a visit of at least two hours. It is recommended to book an underground tour in advance.

Science North

100 Ramsey Lake Road

Next up is Science North, Canada's largest science centre. Explore four floors of hands-on exhibits, from the bed of nails to live animal ambassadors. Don't miss the IMAX theatre or Sean Kenney's Brick Master Studio exhibit, 100 sculptures using more than 2 million Lego pieces.

Note: Plan for a visit of at least two hours.

Stompin' Tom Statue and Townehouse Tavern

240 & 206 Elgin Street

Calling Stompin' Tom fans! Check out the Sudbury Saturday Night star sculpture outside the Sudbury Community Arena, then head next door to the Townehouse Tavern, where Stompin' Tom Connors worked and played, for a pint and some hearty pub food, with great vegan options.

Deluxe Hamburgers

1737 Regent Street

Have you heard that Sudbury is a one-arch town? A nod to Deluxe Hamburgers, Sudbury's beloved local diner with a single arch in its logo. Known for fresh-cut fries and the legendary chicken on a bun, and the gravy, oh the gravy! It's a hometown classic.

Ramsey Lake Boardwalk

Parking is available at 506 Elizabeth, 100 Ramsey Lake Road (Science North) or Corner of York St. & Paris St.

In a city with over 330, head to one of the city's most scenic walks right in the city on the Bell Park boardwalk. Take a beautiful stroll along the world's second-largest city contained lake, Ramsey Lake. (Sudbury is also home to the world's largest city contained lake, Lake Wanapitei)

Note: The boardwalk is 2 km

Crosscut Distillery

Wind down with a craft cocktail or tasting flight at Crosscut Distillery, the award-winning grain-to-glass distillery.

Porketta

Possibly Sudbury's most famous dish with deep Italian roots is porketta, a well-spiced pork roast served at many family events and celebrations.
